

September 12, 2017

BOARD MEETING

A Town Board Meeting was called to order at 7 pm on September 12, 2017 by Chairman Tony Suda.

Roll call was taken. Present were Chairman Suda, Supervisor Reinart, Supervisor Ken Kuhn, treasurer Shawn Huth, clerk Donna Kuhn, Ed Kuhn, and Jerald Sebesta. The agenda was legally noticed and approved.

The minutes from last month's meeting were read by the clerk and approved. Treasurer's report was read and accepted. Treasurer will transfer interest from CD to general fund. Money market deposit will be held until new fire truck correct cost and payment is known.

One building permit was issued for Tom Curler.

Driveway Ordinance review will be put on January agenda to be reviewed and to consider change of culverts from 20' to 30'.

Items for the 2018 budget were discussed. Cost of the new fire truck is not yet known. Garage door will be added for \$20,000. Gravel will be estimated to be \$80,000.

Clerk report:

*The Granton School District is holding a referendum vote on October 10. She is working with the Granton school board to have Washburn's voting done at Grant Hall. Washburn has one 80 acre parcel in the Granton district which is occupied by an Amish family that is not registered to vote. Cost savings for all involved is the motive. Board desires to look into having that parcel return to the Neillsville School district.

*Sherwood will have the Fall clean-up on Oct. 21 at the Sherwood Town Hall for all 4 Towns collaborating in this bi-annual effort.

*Equalized value of the Town has increased this year.

*Recycling information for distributing with taxes was discussed.

Chairman will decide on TRIP application. WISLR report is due by Dec. The Town has received the bridge inspection reports from the County. Grass has been trimmed around bridges.

Robin S. of 73 needs repair from damage incurred from school bus. Signs will be ordered.

Due to multiple conflicts involving price, inconsistency, correct delivery of product, and a very long wait for order to be filled, the Town of Washburn will not be doing trade with Comtech, Inc. in the future. Round culverts were delivered instead of arch culverts. Culverts were returned. Comtech pressed them with a back hoe. Reinart reported that it was not straight when Goetz buried it. Town was over-billed, and Chairman will inquire about correction.

Credit card will be tabled.

Suda moved / Ken Kuhn 2nd that the Town of Washburn adopt an updated fire charge fee schedule effective immediately. All – yes. Carried.

Reinart moved / Ken Kuhn 2nd, not to donate county dog refund to the Clark County Humane society. Carried.

Owen Ave culvert is complete. County aid application has been turned in.

Bridge proposal letters were sent and there is some response coming back.

Bills approved and paid.
