

**July 7, 2020**

**BOARD MEETING**

A Town Board Meeting was called to order at 7 pm on July 7, 2020 by Chairman Dale Reinart. Roll call was taken. Present were Chairman Reinart, Supervisor Ken Kuhn, Supervisor Ed Kuhn, clerk Donna Kuhn, and patrol Jerald Sebesta. Absent was treasurer Shawn Huth. Also present was representative of Paul Bugar Trucking. The agenda was legally noticed and approved.

Bill for gravel hauled by Bugar Trucking was inspected by the Board and paid. Hauling went well.

Minutes from the June Board meeting were read and approved. Treasurer's report was accepted as sent. Question on whether July GTA was received so culverts and ditching can be planned. Clerk will contact Treasurer. Letters to delinquent bills were sent. Will pursue state collection after 30 days.

One building permit to Thomas Mortenson for garage.

August Board meeting will need to be rescheduled due to elections being held on the second Tuesday. Board set date for Wednesday, August 12.

The 5 Towns in the SCCAT recycling contract with Advanced Disposal will meet at Sherwood hall on July 22 to discuss contract renewal.

Road permit for Pray Ave was signed and will be sent to Opelt Sand and Gravel with stipulations regarding repairing any road damage with up to 10 loads of gravel and maximum speed of 35 mph. This will be for a fleet of 19 trucks. Effective this date through Dec. 31, 2020.

Pray Ave's Cunningham bridge is scheduled to commence on Monday.

**Ken Kuhn moved / Ed Kuhn 2<sup>nd</sup>, to purchase a 3/4" impact wrench. All yes. Carried.**

The State / Municipal agreement for replacing the south Cardinal Ave bridge over Rock Creek was signed by Reinart and sent back to the State. It is scheduled to begin in 2023 with an estimated cost of \$440,000. Estimate for the Town is \$88,400.

Board discussed ditching and culvert projects to be done.

Reinart will get estimate from Strangfeld Auto for repair of truck fenders that are rusting out.

**Dale Reinart moved / Ken Kuhn 2<sup>nd</sup>, to update the Fireworks permit to reflect the new fire chief, Gary Eibergen. All yes. Carried.**

The Chairman was approached regarding an inquiry for creating a 40 hr. / mo employee position. Consensus was that there would not be a need for these work hours at this time.

**Ed Kuhn moved / Ken Kuhn 2<sup>nd</sup>, to adopt Ordinance #2020 – 2 to create Split Shifts for election workers. All yes. Carried.**

Bills approved and paid.
